Our uniform:

Uniform is an important part of our school identity. We want our pupils to wear it with pride and to understand that it represents that they are valued members of a special community.

SP Sutton Park PRIMARY SCHOOL

The compulsory uniform for Sutton Park Primary is:

- Sutton Park Primary sweatshirt/cardigan (SP logo preferred)
- White polo shirt (SP logo embroidered is preferred)
- Grey trousers/skirt/pinafore
- Grey tights/socks
- Black school shoes (no trainers)

For PE, the compulsory uniform is:

- Burgundy sports t-shirt (SP logo)
- Black shorts
- Black PE pumps/trainers for outdoors
- · Plain black tracksuits can also be worn.

NB: Children wear their PE kits all day on their timetabled PE days.

These will be shared by your child's class teacher in September.



School have offered financial support in resourcing uniform multiple times this academic year. One such offer is currently open via the MS Forms link shared with all parents.

The wearing of school uniform is **COMPULSORY** and all pupils must attend school in the items listed here, not their own clothes.



There is no expectation from school for parents to provide stationery items for their child.

School will provide pens, pencils, rulers, glue sticks etc. to every child in September.

Own pencil cases are not permitted in school.

Starting school:

September 2022:

Monday 4th and Tuesday 5th September – Teacher training days Wednesday 6th September – School begins for all pupils from Reception-Y6



Arrival and Departure Procedures:

- The doors to school open at 8:45am and we operate a 10-minute window for children to get into school each morning.
- Registration begins at 8:55am and any child who is not in the classroom by this time, is late.
- Lates must enter school via the main school reception to receive their mark.
- The school day ends at 15:15pm.
- Children should be dropped off and collected from their phase playground (Phase 1, Phase 2 or Phase 3) If your child in is Nursery or Reception, they are dropped off at the EYFS gate, adjacent to the main school field.



THE GOVERNMENT ARE ENFORCING INCREASED SANCTIONS FOR POOR ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY FROM SEPTEMBER. IT IS VITAL THAT CHILDREN ARE IN SCHOOL (AND ON TIME) EVERY DAY.

Where there are attendance or punctuality concerns:

Don't be surprised if a class teacher or senior leader speaks to you about your child's attendance. The aim for all pupils is a **minimum 95% attendance** across the academic year.

School have a legal responsibility to act when attendance or punctuality falls short of this expectation. It is extremely important to us that all children are in school and on time, daily. Not attending school regularly is proven to damage a child's academic potential.

We use Fast Track processes and do not authorise any leave during term-time. Please do not book any family holidays during term time as these will not be authorised and there is a high probability of you being fined.

When things are happening at home that may affect your child's attendance or punctuality:

Communication is extremely important. We understand that families can face challenges and will always work with parents and carers to find solutions to any barriers to attendance/punctuality. Your first port of call for contact in these situations is Miss Maltby.



Lunchtimes:

- Our kitchen team provide delicious, nutritious hot meals every day. These are automatically free to any child in Reception, Y1 or Y2 as part of the universal free school meals initiative from the government.
- Other children may also be eligible for a free school meal, as part of the pupil premium free school meals offer. If you think this applies to you, please contact our school office via enquiry@suttonparkprimary.co.uk for more information.
- Dinners can be purchased at a cost of £2.25 per day* (payable via ParentPay) Healthy packed lunches are also permitted for all pupils who do not wish to have a hot school dinner.

Snack time:

- Children in Years 1-6 are permitted to bring a healthy snack, such as fruit or a cereal bar, with them to school each day. Crisps, biscuits and sweets are examples of snacks not permitted in school.
- We are a **NUT-FREE school** so no products containing nuts can be brought into school.

Water bottles:

- Pupils have access to fresh, filtered water freely across the school day in all year groups.
- NEW FOR SEPTEMBER: School have purchased a SP water bottle for all pupils for access to water in classrooms. No water bottles brought from home will be permitted in class. These can only be used at lunchtime with packed lunches.



Houses:

From September, classes will be moving from the house corridor approach previously used and back to 'phase' corridors. This change will ensure pupils regularly see friends from the other class in their year group and allow for greater curriculum collaboration too. Phase playgrounds and class locations are explained below.

- Houses form an important part of our rewards system. Children work individually and collectively to earn as many house points as they can across the school week.
- Totals are shared in our celebration assemblies and special, half-termly rewards are planned for the winning house.

Behaviour:

- We encourage children to behave in a sociable and mindful way through positive encouragement.
- · We have rules in school that are for the children's safety and well- being.
- Children are encouraged to understand the necessity of rules.
- We have high expectations at Sutton Park Primary and unacceptable behaviour is always recorded and reported to parents.
- Should there be any concerns about your child's behaviour we will inform you at an early stage. We always work co-operatively with parents to identify the reasons and plan positively to help your child overcome them.

Children's positive behaviours are celebrated in many ways including:

- House points
- Star of the week awards
- Celebration assemblies
- Positive praise postcards
- Headteacher awards
- Annual prize-giving ceremony







Working with parents:

No one knows your child better than you!

Our parent-partnership is an integral part of school life.





We pride ourselves on being available to listen to any queries, concerns or important information you need to share.

Our pastoral and inclusion teams are also on hand to provide advice, support and a listening ear when one is needed.

Parent and School Communication

As a trust, effective communication with our school communities is extremely important to us. From time to time we know that you may have queries or questions that you need to raise with school staff or the senior team. We understand that it is important for you to know when you should expect to receive a response.



We will aim to respond to parent enquiries as follows:

- If you call the school and require a phone call back, we will endeavour to return your call within 24 hours.
- If you email your enquiry, we will endeavour to reply to your email within 48 hours of receipt.
- If you send in a written letter, we will endeavour to acknowledge receipt of the correspondence within 72 hours (unless an existing policy sets out an alternative timeframe).

We hope that you will find these timeframes useful for your reference. They apply to the working day and are not applicable during holiday periods.

As ever, members of the staff team will always try to make themselves available to you in the morning and at the end of the day and in the first instance you should see your child's class teacher in order that they can assist you in a timely way. If you ever have an urgent concern, please make the school aware so that we can respond appropriately.

We politely remind you that we can only discuss your child with you and are not able to discuss or share information relating to any other pupil.




However, the majority of our parent communication is sent via the Class Dojo platform. This free-to-use app can be downloaded by multiple family members to ensure everyone is kept informed.










Medicines and illness:
