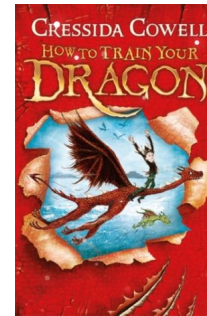
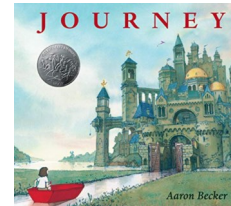
Our P.E. topics this term are Tag Rugby, Yoga and Handball.
