Parents received a letter last week outlining our introduction of Class Dojo as our main communication platform moving forwards. This was in response to parent feedback about wanting more regular reminders for trips, events, non-uniform days etc.

This platform allows multiple parents and carers to receive push notifications from school, enabling us to send out regular reminders to multiple family members, without the expense of a paid text messaging system.
