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Parent feedback survey:

Thank you to everyone who completed the parent feedback form sent out last week via Class Dojo. We received a total of 29 responses and appreciate all of the comments shared.

Below is a summary of the positive things said about our school and the suggested areas for further improvement.

We added a 'star rating' question to our survey and were thrilled to see our final, average star rating as 4.25! 83% of parents who responded gave us 4 or more stars! Fantastic!
